READINGS: 1. Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13; 2. Corinthians 1:26-31; Matthew 5:1-12. Response to Psalm 145:7-10 How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Alleluia! Alleluia!! Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for revealing the mysteries of the kingdom to mere children. Alleluia!

REFLECTION:

The virtue of humility and being poor in spirit stands out in today's readings. The first reading exhorts everyone to seek the Lord and stay humble; also, the gospel exalts the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Humility therefore is the virtue that makes us aware of our dependency on God and the acceptance of who we are before God. Additionally, it is the longing of the human heart to be satisfied by God instead of material things. Indeed, it is the mother of all virtues without which no one can please God or attain true happiness.

The eight beatitudes which Jesus presents to us in the gospel are not new commandments but a kind of practical roadmap to true happiness and finding favour in the sight of God. They confront us with the decisive choice concerning worldly standards and values which lead to destruction. The standards of Christ lead to true happiness and eternal life. This is so because when one is poor in spirit, there is enough space in his heart to possess God as the ultimate treasure and dependency on God as the source of everything he/she has. That is why a humble person can sing thus "O Lord, you are my God for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting, my body pines for you like a dry weary land without water" (Psalm 62). My dear brothers and sisters, let us seek first the kingdom of God and its righteousness and every other thing we need will be added unto us (Mt. 6:33). God Loves You !!!
