+ The Baptism of The Lord, Year A Sunday, 08th January 2023

READINGS: 1. Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; 2. Acts of the Apostles 10:34-38; Gospel Matthew 3:13-17. Psalm: 72: 1-2. 7-8. 10-13. Psalm. 'The Lord will bless his people with peace.' Alleluia! Alleluia!! The heavens opened and the Father's voice resounded: 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Alleluia!

REFLECTION: The Feast of the Baptism of Jesus marks the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of his public ministry. It is the occasion of the first public revelation of all the Three Persons in the Holy Trinity. Hence, Jesus' Baptism by John was a very important event. First it was a moment of identification with us sinners, though Jesus was sinless, He received the Baptism of repentance to identify Himself with His people whom he has come to save. Secondly, it was a moment of conviction about Jesus' identity and mission. The voice of the Father was heard saying, 'this is my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased' confirms He is the son of God and His mission was to preach the Good News of God's love and save the world. Third it was a moment of empowerment for the mission, with the Holy Spirit descending and resting upon Jesus in the form of a dove, bestowing on Him the power to the good news, to heal the sick.

The Baptism of Jesus reminds us of our identity. By our own Baptism, we become sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters to one another, members of his Church, heirs of Heaven. Jesus' Baptism also reminds us of our mission to proclaim the good news of God's salvation and to appreciate the Divine Presence in others by loving them and serving them in humility. To live as children of God in thought, word and action and grow daily in intimacy with God by personal and family prayers, participating in the Holy Mass and by frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lastly, it is a day to thank God for the graces we received in Baptism which made us sons and daughters of God and renew our Baptismal promises.

On behalf of the Parish Clergy and Parish Team, we thank you for the gifts, cards and kind words. Thank you also to the many volunteers who helped to create a welcoming environment and rich liturgies during 2022. We give thanks to God for all He has given to us and we pray for His continued blessings in the year ahead.
