+ Fourth Sunday of Lent, Year A Sunday, 19th March 2023

READINGS: 1. Samuel 16:1.6-7.10-13; 2. St Paul to Ephesians 5:8-14; Gospel John 9:1-41. Response to Psalm 22.1. The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Gospel Acclamation, Glory to you, O Christ, you are the Word of God! I am the light of the world, says the Lord; anyone who follows me will have the light of life. Glory to you, O Christ, you are the Word of God!

REFLECTION: Today, the fourth Sunday of Lent is called 'Laetare Sunday' because it is marked by relaxation from the penitential character of the Lenten season. The Church exhorts us to be joyful and relax because Christ our shepherd illuminates and heals our blindness to give us spiritual vision. The first reading narrates how David was chosen as king. The Prophet Samuel followed God's instructions and did not rush into a fast decision by anointing any one as king. Instead, he waited patiently until the right candidate, David arrived. How often have we made wrong decisions because we are not patient for the right time or right person to arrive. Therefore, patience is the key in discerning the Will of God in our lives.

In the gospel, Jesus restores the sight of a man born blind. Here, he proves his care for the wellbeing of his flock especially the sick and the marginalised. Again, he broke the cultural and religious barriers in order to save the blind man by healing him on a sabbath day. This fulfils his mission as the one who has come to save and give life abundantly. The lesson we must learn from the drama between Christ, the blind man and the Pharisees include the man was obedient to the instruction "Go and wash in thy pool of Siloam." Secondly, we must be consistent with our words, faith and conviction. In spite of the intimidation by the Pharisees, the man that was healed remained truthful and firm without denying Christ, even when he was thrown out of the temple. May our faith remain unshakeable in the face of life's challenges. Peace be with you !!!
