+ Fourth Sunday of Easter, Year A Sunday, 30th April 2023

READINGS: 1. Acts of the Apostles 2:14.36-41; 2. St Peter 2:20-25; Gospel John 10:1-10. Response to Psalm 22;1-6. The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Gospel Acclamation Alleluia, Alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me. Alleluia!

REFLECTION: Today, we celebrate 'Good Shepherd Sunday' or 'Vocation Sunday' which highlights the various ways God cares, provides and protects us. The Old Testament speaks of God as the Shepherd of his people, thus, "the Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want" (Ps 23) and "we are his people, the sheep of his pasture" (Ps 80). In addition, the New Testament depicts Jesus as the Good Shepherd, where it states, "I am the Good Shepherd, I know my sheep and my sheep know me and I lay down my life for them." (John 10:11)

What can shepherding teach us about our relationship with God? Apparently, the shepherd will always take his sheep to greener pastures for feeding and bring them back to shelter at the end of the day. Each sheep can recognise the voice of the shepherd and follow at his beckening. Additionally, so familiar was the voice of the shepherd to his sheep that each was called by a distinct name. The shepherd also protects his sheep from wild animals and is willing to lay down his life to save them. As a result, he usually sleeps at the door of the fold to ward off any attack. These qualities tell us how much God loves us, provides for us and is willing to protect us because we are his sheep. On your part, how much are you willing to follow the voice of Jesus the Good Shepherd. If only we know the peace, security and the joy of submitting fully to Jesus, we will never go astray. Therefore, may the Lord keep your going-out and coming-in safe from every danger now and evermore. God Loves You!
