## 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A 9th July 2023 (Sea Sunday)

READINGS: 1. Zechariah 9:9-10; 2. Romans 8:9. 11-13; Gospel Matthew 11:25-30. Response to Psalm Ps 144:1-2. 8-11. 13-14. I will bless your name for ever, O God my King. Gospel Acclamation; Alleluia, Alleluia! Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for revealing the mysteries of the kingdom to mere children. Alleluia!

REFLECTION In today's gospel, Jesus thanks the Father for revealing to his followers the wisdom and knowledge of God. What does Jesus' prayer tells us about God and our relationship with Him? First, it tells us that God is both Father and Lord of earth and heaven; also, the Creator and Author of all that is. His authority and gracious care extends to every living thing, to the welfare of each person made in his image and likeness. He is the source of all human life and all Fatherhood and Motherhood is derived from Him. Therefore, how much do we believe this truth and not allow ourselves misled by created things? Secondly, Jesus' prayer contrasts the "wisdom of the world" with the wisdom which comes from above. The prayer contains an implicit warning that pride can keep us far from the love and knowledge of God. What makes us ignorant and blind to the wisdom of God? Certainly intellectual pride, coldness of heart, stubbornness of will and materials things can shut out God and his rule from our lives. Pride is the root of all vice and evil propelling us to sin against God and to do wrong to our neighbours and have an inordinate love of oneself. In today's gospel, Jesus thanks the Father for revealing to his followers the wisdom and knowledge of God.

Finally, Jesus contrasts pride with child-like simplicity, thus "... and revealing then to mere children." Hence, "mere children" here refers to those who are pure in heart, who recognise their utter dependence on God, those who are open and ready to be taught by God, who feel the pain of the weak and are generous with their gifts. Do you acknowledge your utter dependency on God? Peace be With You!!!
