23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A 10th September 2023 (Education Sunday)

READINGS: 1. Ezekiel 33:7-9; 2. Romans 13:8-10; Gospel Matthew 18:15-20. <u>Response to Psalm</u> Ps 94:1-2.6-9. O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not you hearts. <u>Gospel Acclamation</u>; Alleluia, Alleluia! Your word is truth, O Lord, consecrate us in the truth. Alleluia!

**REFLECTION:** When you are offended, are you willing to put aside your own grievance or injury to seek reconciliation? The Lord wants us to be free from resentment and an unwillingness to forgive. Today, he offers us ways to repair a damaged relationship which is based on Fraternal Charity.

What can we learn from Jesus's instructions? Firstly, speaking directly and privately to the person who has done the harm is necessary instead of spreading it around or brooding over it. These can poison our minds and damage the image of the other person which in turn makes reconciliation difficult. If this step fails, our Lord advices we need to bring another person. It must be someone who is wise and gracious rather than one who is hot-tempered or judgmental. The person is to act as a reconciler and not as a judge. If this second step fails, we should seek the help of the Christian community. The emphasis for this is to restore a broken relationship by seeking the help of other Christians who hopefully will pray and seek a fraternal solution. Lastly, if the Christian community approach fails, Jesus suggests the person be treated like a tax collector. He does not mean we should treat the person like a social outcast, but to treat them the way He would - dine with them, welcome them and continue to reach out to them. In the final analysis, we are called not to give up on efforts to reconcile a broken relationship or bring back a person who has strayed. Jesus refuses no one and he is open to offer pardon, healing and restoration to everyone. Peace be with you!!!

Jesus Said: "My house shall be called a house of prayer." Before Mass - Talk to God, During Mass - Listen to God, After Mass - Talk to each other.
