## 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A 17th September 2023

READINGS: 1. Ecclesiasticus 27:30-28:7; 2. Romans 14:7-9; Gospel Matthew 18:21-35. Response to Psalm Ps 102:1-4.9-12. The Lord is compassion and love, slow to anger and rich in mercy. Gospel Acclamation; Alleluia, Alleluia! Speak, Lord, your servant is listening: you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

**REFLECTION**. Relationships between people is the "balm of life" (Sir 6:16). Once a relationship is broken, it's "Like a bird, you have let your friend/loved one go, you will not get him/her back. The inability to forgive a wrong, makes irretrievable the bond of broken love/relationship. It is difficult to forgive. Yes. I even forgive myself with difficulty: I torment myself with remorse. I do not accept the humiliation of a weakness. But it is only one who has a peaceful relationship with oneself who is able to recognize one's own mistake. He/she knows that a positive recovery from a bitter experience of sin is possible. The urge to break a relationship and to take revenge for the offense suffered are almost always present in us. According to Sirach 27:30-28:7, whoever feels a victim of some injustice instinctively tends to attack those responsible. The most famous example of this limitless revenge is that of Lamech, the son of Cain. A polygamist who sang before the two wives: "I killed a man for wounding me and a boy for striking me. "Do not seek revenge or nurture a grudge against one of your people, but love your neighbour as yourself" (Lev 19:18). Sirach says, avoid the senseless behaviour desire for revenge, anger, resentment. These feelings are an abomination and create an impenetrable shield in the relationship between God and a person. As Christ' disciples, we must go beyond simple justice and to open the heart to mercy. The clemency towards others is an indispensable prerequisite to pray and receive forgiveness from God. "If a person bears resentment against another, how can they ask God for healing?" (v. 3). Sirach lessons teaches us disposition to listen to the word of Jesus the eternal wisdom of old. Romans 14...: A Christian must always keep in mind that he/she does not live for him/herself and for the pursuit of self-interest, but for the Lord. We must therefore, live and die "for the Lord." Matthew 18:21-35. At the time of Jesus, who was at wrong, must recognize his/her error and beg forgiveness and the offended person is obliged to grant it. If he refuses, the offender apologizes in front of two witnesses to prove that they have done everything possible to restore peace. If the offended one dies before the reconciliation, he/she who has done evil must go to his/her grave, and placing a stone, declares: "I have done wrong to you." "How many times must I forgive the offenses of my brother or sister? The Sermon on the Mount says: "If you are about to offer your gift at the altar, and you remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift in front of the altar, go at once and make peace with your brother/ sister and then come back and offer your gift to God" (Mt 5:23-24). Peace, I wish you.

Jesus Said: "My house shall be called a house of prayer." Before Mass - Talk to God, During Mass - Listen to God, After Mass - Talk to each other.
