27th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A 8th October 2023 (Prisoners' Sunday)

READINGS: 1. Isaiah 5:1-7; 2. Philippians 4:6-9; Gospel Matthew 21:33-43. <u>Response to Psalm</u> Ps 79:9.12-16.19-20. The vineyard of the Lord is the House of Israel. <u>Gospel Acclamation</u>; Alleluia, Alleluia! I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my father. Alleluia!

REFLECTION: On this 27th Sunday, the Church asks us to rejoice for being highly favoured because God chose us as his beloved vineyard, as well as appointed us to be in charge of his vineyard. To be able to carry out this task effectively, we need prayers which draw the peace of God closer. In light of this, we are to put on our best in order not to disappoint God who appointed us. The readings use parables to recount God's love and care for Judah and by extension to us, whom God chose as the apple of his eyes and his beloved garden. He did everything possible to make the vineyard fruitful; dug the soil, built a tower, cleared the stones and dug a vine press. Unfortunately, God was rewarded with sour grapes, instead of sweet ones. Hence, He expected justice but found bloodshed, integrity but a cry of distress. Most of us have acted in the same way to our God; we have given Him hardness of heart instead of repentance, indifference instead of love; impurity instead of Holiness. We care more about selling things to our neighbours than to care for our neighbours.

The gospel of the parable of the wicked tenants, richly conveys some truths about God and the way He deals with his people. First, it tells us about God's generosity and trust by leasing out his Vineyard to the tenants. Second, it tells us of his patience and justice by sending several servants to collect his produce. A take home message to all of us is that whatever position we find ourselves, we must do it very well and be ready to render a fruitful account to the Lord of the Vineyard. Because, to whom much is given, much is also expected from them. Have a blessed Sunday.
