32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A 12th November 2023

READINGS: 1. Wisdom 6:12-16. 8-10; 2. Thessalonians 4:13-18; Gospel Matthew 25:1-13. Response to Psalm Ps 130. For you my soul is thirsting, O God, my God. Gospel Acclamation; Alleluia, Alleluia! Stay awake and stand ready, because you do not know the hour when the Son of Man is coming. Alleluia!

REFLECTION: Today, the Church encourages us to seek the Lord and always be ready to welcome Him. God is wisdom, anyone who finds and receives Him will have the fullness of life. Therefore, we must ask God to grant us wisdom to know what to do at all times and how to do it well. That's why the first reading reminds us that wisdom is found by only those who look for her. Here, Wisdom is personified as a woman. Hence, it only takes a wise man to go out in search of her. The wise man does this with patience and hope until he has found her. With wisdom, we will live a good Christian life and be equipped to face the challenges of life.

In the gospel, Jesus used the parable of the ten bridesmaids to teach us how we must be prepared for the challenges of our call. What separates the two categories of bridesmaids is that the same thin line that separates wisdom and foolishness; that is, planning ahead, being patient and prepared. Therefore, the moment of waiting can be a weary moment; but, it should be a moment of grace to be well prepared. We must not become victims of the eleventh hour due to lack of preparation. Hence, Christians ought to be prepared and watchful as those who are alert to the unexpectedness of life. Likewise, when we began our journey of faith, we did not foresee that we would meet trials and temptations. We do not believe that some day, it will cost us a lot to remain faithful to our commitment. Therefore, let us be wise and prepare for the challenges of our call. And not to wait for the challenges to engulf us before we take action. Peace Be With You!!!
