

READINGS: 1. Proverbs 31:10-13.19-20.30-31; 2. Thessalonians 5:1-6; Gospel Matthew 25:14-30. Response to Psalm Ps 130. O blessed are those who fear the Lord. Gospel Acclamation; Alleluia, Alleluia! Even if you have to die, says the Lord, keep faithful, and I will give you the crown of life. Alleluia!

**REFLECTION:** As we draw closer to the end of the Liturgical calendar year A, the Church calls on her children to remain faithful and dedicated to our Master. That is why the first reading presents the qualities of a virtuous woman; she is faithful and knows what to do to keep her family intact. In addition, she holds out her hands to the needy and she is prudent in speech. Hence, it is a call for us to cultivate inner beauty (virtues), to be faithful and devoted to our mission which is to spread the fragrance of God's goodness through our work and talents.

In the gospel, Jesus uses the parable of talent to remind us that given the imminence of his return, each of us must be ready to render a good account of the talents they are endowed with. The parable challenges us to put to use all the potentials God has given us for the sake of his kingdom; most importantly, it instructs us to endure through difficult times and to live in anticipation of his second coming and to display faithfulness. Therefore, we must not be in idleness, but should be industrious and active by bearing effective witness to Christ while bearing in mind that an account must be demanded of us. As trustworthy servants, we must therefore avoid a life of indifference, apathy and complacency towards our work, as these will not fetch us any reward. If we are found faithful, we will surely hear the gracious words of our Master saying to us; "well done, good and faithful servant... come and join in your master's happiness." Peace be with you.
