Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King, Year A 26h November 2023

READINGS: 1. Ezekiel 34:11-12.15-17; 2. Corinthians 15;20-26.28; Gospel Matthew 25:31-46. Response to Psalm Ps 22:1-3.5-6 The Lord is my shephard; there is nothing I shall want. Gospel Acclamation; Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the coming kingdom of our father David! Alleluia!

REFLECTION: Today is the 34th and the last Sunday in Ordinary time, Year A. Most importantly, it is the Solemnity of Christ the King. The feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius X1 in 1925 in order to ward off the deadly influence of secularism. The feast is intended to proclaim in a resounding and effective way Christ's royalty over individuals, families, societies, Governments and Nations. The Church celebrates the King of the universe who rules in power and majesty; the King who is compassionate and loving, and the king who does not rule with iron fist but delivers justice on a platter of gold. In the first reading, the Lord assures us through the Prophet Ezekiel of his readiness to look after us thus: "I am going to look after my flock myself...I shall rescue them... I shall be a true Shepherd to them..." One thing to note is that the pronoun "I" was used to convey two things; first, God's personal interest in his flock and His readiness to do his job. Second, his promise to all us his children which he has long fulfilled through Jesus Christ our King and ruler of the universe.

The gospel reminds us of the reign of Christ. His reign is one of justice because he will judge each one according to his action. He shall uphold the just and reprimand the culprit. There is no corruption, embezzlement or structural injustice in his reign. Rather, his reign will be that of peace and justice. Brethren, our celebration will make more meaning if only we give Christ the highest seat and the key to the kingdom of our heart where he earnestly desires to reign. Peace be with you.
