Second Sunday of Advent, Year B 10th December 2023

READINGS: 1. Isaiah 40:1-5.9-11 2. St Peter 3:8-14; Gospel Mark 1:1-8. Response to Psalm Ps 84:9-14. Let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help. Gospel Acclamation; Alleluia! Alleluia! Prepare a way for the Lord, and make his path straight, and all mankind shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

REFLECTION: Today, being the Second Sunday of Advent, the Church presents the person of John the Baptist as an example of what it means to prepare for Christ's coming. John's life was fuelled by one burning passion - to point others to Jesus Christ and to the coming of his kingdom. The scripture tells us that John was filled with the Holy Spirit even from his mother's womb. The fire of the Holy Spirit dwelt in him and made him the forerunner of the coming Messiah. He was led by the Spirit into the wilderness prior to his ministry where he grew in the Word of God and was tested in preparation for his prophetic mission.

John broke the prophetic silence after the last prophet of the Old Testament (Micah), when he began to speak the Word of God to the people of Israel. His message was similar to the messages of the Old Testament prophets who chided the people of Israel for their unfaithfulness and tried to awaken true repentance by turning from evil ways. Among a people unconcerned with the things of God, it was John's work to awaken their interest, unsettle them from their complacency, and arouse in them enough good Will to recognise and receive Christ when he came. With John, the Holy Spirit begins the restoration of the human race into the divine likeness, prefiguring what would be achieved by the Lord Jesus. Like John the Baptist, we too are called to show Christ to others by living a life that is Christ-centred. Do you point others to Christ in the way you live speak and treat others? Maranatha!
