Palm Sunday, Year B 24th March 2024

READINGS: 1. Isaiah 50:4-7 2. Philippians 2:6-11 Gospel Mark 14:1-15:47. Response to Psalm Ps 21:8-9.17-20.23-24 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Gospel Acclamation; Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory: Christ was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all names. Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory.

Reflection: On this Palm Sunday, the Church celebrates the triumphant entry of Christ into Jerusalem in order to accomplish his paschal mystery. Today's celebration is full of symbols. The green palm is a symbol of peace: "He shall be the Prince and King of peace" (Isa 9:6). The crowd symbolises both praise and denial. This is because the same crowd singing "Hosanna" will soon shout, "crucify Him." Finally, the donkey is symbolic of Christ humility. In the second reading, St Paul highlighted the greatness and depth of Jesus's humility. He recalled his self-emptying: "though He was in the form of God, He did not count equality with God... He humbled himself and became obedient unto death." St Paul admonishes us to be like Jesus, by living a simple, humble and gentle life. Humility and simplicity attract favour from both God and humans.

The gospel is from the passion narrative of Christ. The journey that began with praises (Hosanna, Hosanna) ended with, "crucify Him, crucify Him." But, at both ends, God is still at work and in control because: "we know that in all things, God works for good of those who love him." The narrative presents us with the nature of Christ as true man. He suffered, and died like every other human being. Yet, this did not diminish the fact that He is Lord and God. Through his passion, he has become our role model, while his cross has become our symbol of hope and salvation. So, before you see Jesus as the glorious Lord of Easter, first, think of Him as the wounded and crucified King. May we be filled with graces during this Holy Week. Peace Be with You!
