+ 5TH SUNDAY OF LENT – YEAR C

“Neither do I condemn you; go, and do not sin again.”
(Jn 8.11)

The age we are living in is the last age, the age of Mercy. It began the time Adam and Eve sinned and fell from grace and as a result introduced sin and death, with their concomitant pain and suffering, into human nature (Gen. 3.1-19). Since then, and despite our frequent fall into sin, God has continued to outmatch our transgression with His divine grace and mercy (Rom. 5.20); and, since as creatures we cannot rid itself of sin and guilt, we have to rely entirely and solely on the mercy of God who alone can forgive sins (Mk 2.7; Lk 5.21), to restore us to wholeness. Now at the tail-end of this age, God's grace has exploded in an outpouring of mercy beyond measure through the Paschal Mystery in which Our Lord embraces all sinners and covers all our iniquities, not holding our sins against us (2 Cor. 5.19). This is because God loves us so much that He made His only Son an expiation for our sins (1 Jn 4.9-10; Jn 3.16; Rom. 5.8; 8.32; Eph. 2.4-6). He does not want anyone to perish; rather, He wants all to reach repentance and so be saved (2 Pt 3.9), just as He does not delight in the death of the sinner, but wants the sinner to repent and live (Ezek. 18.23, 32; 32.11). This age of mercy will continue to the *Parousia*, that is, the second coming of Christ, when it must end. At the *Parousia*, Christ will no longer deal with sin which at the present time attracts His mercy and forgiveness. Instead, at the *Parousia*, He will judge everyone, both living and dead (1 Pt 4.5), and reward with eternal life all those who wait eagerly for Him (Heb. 9.26-29). Therefore, while this age lasts, all are given the opportunity to repent of our sins. This repentance entails that we sincerely acknowledge with sorrow all our sins which in themselves offend the divine honour and goodness, that we confess them and obtain God's forgiveness through the Sacrament of Penance, that we turn away from sin altogether, and that we embrace virtue in charity.
