

+ BAPTISM OF THE LORD - YEAR A

"This is My beloved Son, with Whom I am well pleased." (Mt 3.17)

At the start of His public ministry, Our Lord of His own accord went to River Jordan, to John the Baptist – the King to His subject, the Master to His servant, the Creator to His creature, the Immortal One to a mortal man, the Almighty God to a mere human being, the Lord of baptism to an unworthy minister of baptism – to be baptised. What a great act of extreme humility! His baptism was part of the larger mystery of His incarnation and His saving ministry, passion, death, resurrection, and return to heaven. By this mystery, He recreated us and the whole of humanity in Himself (Eph. 2.10; 2 Cor. 5.17). Thus, He conferred His divinity on our fragile human nature, opening to us the door to eternal divine life. He was utterly sinless and did not live with the human condition of sin that called for baptism for the forgiveness of sin (Mt 3.6). He was baptised on our behalf so that subsequently all of us would be baptised into Him, and being buried with Him in baptism, we might die to sin and to the weakness of our human nature, and rise with Him to newness of life (Rom. 6.3-6; Col. 2.12). The final outcome is that our mortality will put on immortality, and our corruptibility, imperishability (1 Cor. 15.53). Our Lord was baptised, not for His own sake or benefit, but solely for that of the whole of humanity and for ours, for our sanctification. In His baptism, He washed our guilt away, renewing and recreating us and our nature in that original image of His that pleased God. His baptism is also instructive. Since He who was without sin most humbly got Himself baptised, anyone who desires life and wants to make the journey to the eternal kingdom of God must also begin with baptism (John 3.3-8).
