+ 1ST SUNDAY OF LENT – YEAR A

"Jesus was led by the Spirit out into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil." (Mt 4.10)

Our Lord's temptation reveals, among other things, that the devil is real and active in the life of the individual and of the human race. The idea of such an active spiritual entity may sound fanciful to some; yet he is real, and those who deny his reality run the risk of not knowing what hits them when he strikes. The devil (also called Satan, Lucifer, and demon) is an angel of God in whom was found error (Job 4.18). By sinning, he fell from supernatural grace. He leads an army of fellow fallen angels (Mt 25.41) who, like himself, were not spared by God (2 Pt 2.4). For his rebellion, he was forcefully ejected from heaven and thrown down to the earth (Rev. 12.7-9), and he fell like lightning (Lk 10.18). His fall, earlier recalled in prophecy, destined him to hell (Is. 14.12-15) where he will receive his eternal punishment (Jude v. 6: 2 Pt 2.4). Until then, he is resolved not to be in hell alone. His envy has earlier brought death into the world (Wis. 2.24). Now as the 'ruler' of this world (Jn 14.30) and the 'prince' of the powers of the air, he works on the children of unbelief (Eph. 2.2). He has the power to deceive and to seduce people into error and sin (Gen. 3.1-7). A murderer from the beginning, a liar and the father of both lie itself and liars (Jn 8.44), he relentlessly seeks to deceive, and to entice and persuade people to sin, and often, even to possess an individual completely. But, just as Our Lord firmly resisted him and his overtures (Mt 4.1-11), we too must resist him and his wiles, firm in faith, even as he prowls around, looking for someone to devour (1 Pt 5.8-9; Eph. 6.11; Jam. 4.7). It is essentially to defeat him and undo all his works that Our Lord came into the world (1 Jn 3.8).
