"I was blind, now I see." (John 9.25)

Brothers and sisters in Christ, in these trying times, I join our Church leaders, the bishops to pray for all of you and your families, for our country, and, indeed, for the whole world, and to assure you that what we are experiencing now, despite the pain and anxiety it is causing many people, will come to pass. We are witnessing a significant event in history and will survive it. God willing, we will emerge on the other side stronger in every respect. What we must do in these times is what Moses enjoined the Israelites to do when they were besieged by the overwhelming forces of the Egyptians and had no way of escape. He said to them: "Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the Lord" (Exod. 14.13). So we need to put our trust firmly in the Lord and not panic or do anything that could undermine the veritable efforts being made by governments, scientists, and medical personnel to combat the outbreak. We hear in the gospel today how Our Lord restored sight to the man who was born blind. To cure the man, Our Lord first spat on the ground and made clay of the spittle. He then anointed the man's eyes with the clay and ordered him to go and wash in the pool of Siloam. The man obeyed the Lord's instruction carefully and came away seeing clearly. Our Lord could have cured him without making clay of His spittle and ordering him to go and wash in a specific pool, but He did. He has set up governments and institutions, and has given various gifts to people in society. Through these, He guides us and takes care of us in all our needs. Let us put our faith in Him, and also follow the guidelines and instructions we are given, and we will overcome this problem.
