+ DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

“Jesus stood among them and said to them; Peace be with you.” (Jn 20.19)

On this Sunday of Divine Mercy, we offer this prayer: Lord Jesus, You went about all the cities and villages “healing every disease and every infirmity” (Mt 9.35) At Your command, the sick were made well. Come to our aid now, in the midst of this coronavirus pandemic, that we may experience Your healing love. Heal those who are sick with the virus; may they regain their strength and health through the care they receive. Heal us of our fears that prevent us from doing what is right; in place of our anxiety, give us Your peace. Heal us of our pride that makes us fail to recognise our limits and our total dependence on You. Stay by our side at this time of great distress. Support all those who, due to this pandemic, suffer, socially and economically. Be with those who have died from the virus; may they be at rest with You in Your eternal peace. Be with the families of those who are sick or have died; as they worry and grieve, defend them from illness and despair. Be with the doctors, nurses, and all medical personnel who seek to heal and help those affected, and put themselves at risk in the process; may they know Your protection. Be with the leaders of nations; give them the wisdom to act with charity and true concern for the wellbeing of the people they serve. Guide the efforts of governments and researchers, and enable them to find an effective and permanent solution to this pandemic. May all know Your peace and work together to overcome this ill and its effects. Whether we are home or abroad, around people suffering from this illness or not, Lord Jesus Christ, stay with us and heal us, as we endure and mourn, persist and prepare. Amen.
