# + $15^{TH}$ SUNDAY – YEAR A

"A sower went out to sow." (Matthew 13.3)

My friend's earliest recollection of hearing the gospel read at Mass happened when he was about three years old. He had been taken for Mass to a primary school that also served as a Mass centre. Till this day, he still remembers hearing the priest read at that Mass of seed falling on the ground. At that age, he neither understood the reading nor what he felt about it. But he always looks back to that moment as the very first time he became conscious of his vocation to serve the cause of the gospel. It appears that the gospel he heard the priest read that Sunday fell like the seed of faith and found rich soil in his heart. As years pass by, he grew in the consciousness of that vocation and went on to become a sower of the seed of faith in people's hearts. His experience makes us to look at the parable of the sower from a different perspective. We have always looked at this parable from the viewpoint of the way we receive the Word of God we hear at every Mass. We don't normally look at it from the viewpoint of us being sowers of the seed. Actually, we are called to be sowers of the seed of faith in the young, in unbelievers, in society. We answer this call when we get the children baptised, when we take them to Mass, gather them around us for prayer, tell them about God, or share our faith with our neighbour. We are also called to sow the seed of authentic human values in society, the seed of love, of truth, of peace, of solidarity, of the virtues. In various ways, we try to do this by witnessing to the values in our own lives and in our families. So, just as we should be the good soil that receives the seed and bears its fruit, we should also be good sowers of the seed.

# **REOPENING OF OUR CHURCH:**

Our church is now open for public Mass for the second week, and things have been running smoothly. To keep them going that way, please note the following:

- The government requires that the church keeps a record of those of those who attend each Mass, to make it possible to trace and test in the event of an infection occurring in the church. For that reason, you can visit the parish's microsite to sign up for the Mass you wish to attend. Alternatively, cards will be available at the church for you to put down your name and phone number as you enter the church. Please cooperate to help us observe the guideline;
- Please observe the Social Distancing rule;
- The Sunday Mass obligation remains suspended. Everyone 70 years old or above, and all vulnerable people are advised not to attend Mass;
- All are requested to observe all the hygiene protocols, and to follow the one-way direction;
- Communion will be only on the palm stretched out to the priest full length;
- Please put your Offering in the basket at the exit point as you leave the church at the end of Mass;
- There will be no singing during Mass;
- More volunteers are needed to help clean the pews and the church after each Mass. Please, give a helping hand at the end of Mass;
- During weekdays and Sunday, the church will be open for private prayer

30 minutes before Mass each day and will be locked immediately after Mass.

**Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals** can now take place in the church. Please contact the Parish Clergy if you wish to arrange any.

<u>**Confessions:**</u> The priest are available for confessions. Please contact them to arrange a suitable time.

Planned Giving: We thank God that our beloved church is now open for individual prayer and Mass, . Just prior to the lockdown, I was preparing to issue the new boxes of Offertory envelopes. Sadly, this cannot yet happen. Putting monies through the Presbytery letterbox is not advisable.
