#### "Let both grow together until the harvest." Mt 13.30)

The Church is by nature holy; however, it is also the Church of saints and sinners. By virtue of its Head, the Lord, the sinless and holy One of God (Mk 1.24; Jn 6.69), Whose Body it is (Col. 1.18; Eph. 1.22-23; 4.12; 5.23), the Church is "without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish" (Eph. 5.27). At the same time, though called to that perfection, the Church has to deal daily with the reality and effects of sin in its own life, in virtue of its members the weakness of whose will naturally exposes them to the experience of moral failure. In and through the Lord, and by the help of His grace, some of those members go on to overcome the presence of sin in their lives and, having attained perfection, become saints and the citizens of the eternal kingdom of heaven. Other members keep living with sin, yet without ceasing in the meantime to be members of the Church. God allows the coexistence of sanctity and sinfulness in the Church, and of goodness and evil in the world, to keep sharp the contrast between the choice for good or for evil that we have to make while we live. If He so wishes, He could establish two Churches in this life, one for holy people, and the other for sinful people; and He could create two worlds, one for good people, and the other for bad people, so that the good would never have to mingle with the bad. He has reserved that separation for eternal life when saints will live in heaven, totally and permanently apart from and uncontaminated by sinners, while sinners will dwell in the experience of eternal damnation in hell, totally without the remedy of the goodness of the saints.

 During weekdays and Sunday, the church will be open for private prayer 30 minutes before Mass each day and will be closed immediately after Mass.
