## **+ 2<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY OF CHRISTMAS – YEAR B**

**“To all who received Him, who believed in His name, He gave power to become children of God.” (John 1.12)**

Janus was a pious king in Roman mythology who went on to be venerated as a god. He had two faces, one face looking forward, and the other backward. With the two faces, he could see at the same time what lay ahead and what lay behind him without having to turn his head, signifying his ability to see the future and the past, the beginning and the end, the inside and the outside of things. He was also regarded as the god of transition who stood between two worlds, the world of war transitioning to the world of peace. January – the first month of the year – was named after this Roman god, Janus. It marks the end of the past year, and the beginning of the new one. Like the present that connects the past and the future, January reminds us of the journey we all must make from our past to our future through the present. It invites us to be mindful of where we are coming from, while keeping where we are going in view. The persons we are today were shaped by our past, and have much to say about who we become in future. We are mindful of our past, not to relive it (except where we cannot move forward unless we do so), or to be trapped in it, but to learn from it in shaping our future. Sometimes, we may need to forget – but not to deny or suppress – our past in order to make meaningful progress in shaping our future. St Paul understood the significance of this. Through the Philippians he teaches us to forget what lies behind us and, straining forward to what lies ahead, to “press on towards the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus” (Phil. 3.12-14). In the same way, we need to forget all the troubles and frustrations of 2020 now gone, and press on towards the rich possibilities of 2021.
