+ LENT 3RD SUNDAY – YEAR B

“He spoke of the temple that was His Body.” (Jn 2.21)

Of all the things we possess in life, none is more intimate and personal to us than our own body. We may dispose of any of the things we possess, but never of our body; for we not only possess our body, we are also constituted by it and can never be separated from it without suffering our mortal dissolution. Also, nobody other than ourselves has any right to our body except with our explicit or implied permission. Without that permission, our exclusive right to our body will suffer violence from anyone who touches our body even slightly. So, an unauthorised contact with our body by another person, whether the contact causes physical harm to our body or not, is unacceptable and, in certain circumstances, also a crime. But our right to our body is not absolute; in some cases, contact with our body that is not authorised by us can be necessary and justified, for instance, when someone who is committing a crime is physically restrained. Beyond this, too, our body is ultimately not our own; it belongs wholly to Our Lord Who has purchased it with a price, that it, with His own blood (1 Cor. 6.19-20). It has become the temple of God and of the Holy Spirit Who dwells in it (1 Cor. 3.16-17). Because it has been consecrated to God in our baptism, and nourished in the Eucharist with Our Lord's own Body and thereby made one body with Him (Jn 6.56-57; Rom. 6.4-5), our body is now destined to escape corruption and be resurrected (Rom. 8.23). So, though our body belongs to us and not to another human being, we no longer have the right to do just anything at all we like to it or with it, except to glorify God with it (1 Cor. 6.20), and to do only that which is authorised by the Lord to Whom it wholly belongs.
