# + 13<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY – YEAR B

She said, 'If I touch even His garments, I shall be made well.' (Mark 5.28)

It is customary for Catholics to keep and venerate genuine relics of Saints. The relics are objects associated with the Saints, such as the items the Saints owned or used, or parts of the Saints' bodies which during their earthly lives were temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 6.19), but which, after their deaths, have been glorified. By honouring the memories of the Saints in this and other ways, the faithful seek to obtain the benefits that God bestows. Historically, the practice has been directly linked to numerous miracles, including the healing of the sick, the raising of the dead, and the casting out of devils. The link has its antecedents in the Scripture. Just as the sick were healed merely by the shadow of St Peter falling on them as he walked past (Acts 5.15), the aprons or handkerchiefs that touched St Paul were taken to the sick who got cured of their illnesses or freed of evil spirits in them (Acts 19.12). The Old Testament evidence is also striking. Apart from the bones of Joseph carried along and revered by the Israelites (Exod. 13.19; Josh. 24.32), a dead man came back to life when his dead body touched the bones of the prophet Elisha (2 Kg 13.21). By performing such miracles, God is showing forth the honour He Himself bestows on the relics of the Saints. The relics themselves, however, do not possess inherent powers; they are only occasions used by God to manifest His divine benevolence. Therefore, they are not to be worshipped or used in racketeering. The faithful should rather look beyond the relics to the Saints associated with them and, from there, focus on God to Whom alone all honour and glory belong.
