Who then can be saved? Mk 10:26

The disciples of Jesus knew from the Old Testament (OT) that wealth was considered a sign of God's favour on a person (Job. 1:10; Ps 128:1-2; Is. 3:10). They understood that they who are rich have greater chances of doing good. Thus, they were provoked to astonishment when Jesus declared that it will be so hard for rich people to go to heaven. This was apparently a contradiction to the OT concept. So, they said among themselves, "who then can be saved". Jesus however, had a new insight to impart about riches and the rich as they have many temptations to overcome which lie not on the path of the poor. One such huddle is the temptation to trust in the riches, place confidence in them, expect protection and say to their gold, that which they should say only to their God, 'Thou art my hope' (Job 31:24). It is almost impossible for they who have such value for earthly wealth, to be brought to place the right value upon Christ and the grace he gives. The danger therefore, does not come from possessing riches as much as from placing one's trust in them. It is easier for the camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man 'who trusts in riches' to enter the Kingdom of God. Some have suggested that there might have been a wicket-gate into Jerusalem commonly known as Eye of a Needle for its narrowness and straightness, through which a camel could not pass unless he were unloaded and made to kneel like the camels in Gen 24:11. Others think that the word translated as camel could also mean a cable-rope which cannot pass through the eye of a needle unless it is untwisted into single threads. In both cases, a rich man has to be unburdened of his attachment to wealth and prestige and humble himself to the duties of a humble religion, loosed and disentangled from the riches and their false securities, else like the cable-rope, he is only good for nothing but to cast an anchor to the earth. With God, all things are possible. Jesus eases the minds of the apostles by reminding them what seems impossible to man is by the grace of God, a possibility. In other words, salvation is ultimately a gratuitous gift of God to those who trust in him. This rich young man that came to Jesus was not ready and willing to let go of the securities of wealth.
