+ *Third Sunday of Easter, Year A*
Sunday, 23rd April 2023

READINGS: 1. Acts of the Apostles 2:14.22-33; 2. St Peter 1:17-21; Gospel Luke 24:13-35. Response to Psalm 15:1-2.5.7-11. Show us, Lord, the path of life. *Gospel Acclamation, Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, explain the scriptures to us. Make our hearts burn within us as you talk to us. Alleluia!*

REFLECTION: Life can sometimes be filled with hopelessness which can lead to desperation; however, it can also be the start of a journey to faith. To be hopeless or lonely is a reminder that within us is a void that can be filled only by Jesus who walks with us even when we don't recognise him. In the gospel reading, the two disciples who walk the road to Emmaus were hopeless. They believed that Jesus would save them from Roman captivity; but, to their disappointment, they saw how He was arrested, tortured and crucified. Now, they walk back to their homes feeling hopeless. In their confused state, they forgot all the teachings about the resurrection and fail to recognise Jesus who joins their company and explains to them the prophecy that Christ would have to suffer, die and rise from death. Slowly, their minds were open to understanding; then, loneliness gives way to joy and hope finally blooms when they recognised Jesus during the breaking of bread (Eucharist).

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Christianity does not promise a secure life or life free from loneliness and pain, which may make us question sometimes if God exists. On this incident of the disciples to Emmaus, St. Augustine of Hippo wrote "they were so disappointed when they saw Him hanging on the cross, that they forgot His teachings, did not look for his resurrection and failed to keep his promises in mind." Nevertheless, the good news is that God is always with us in the joys and challenges of life. Peace be with you!


