## First Sunday in Lent, Year B 18th February 2024

READINGS: 1. Genesis 9:8-15 2. St Peter 3:18-22; Gospel Mark 1:12-15. <u>Response to Psalm</u> Ps 24:4-9. Your ways, Lord, are faithfulness and love for those who keep your covenant. <u>Gospel Acclamation</u>; Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory! Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the month of God. Praise to you, O Christ, king of eternal glory! Alleluia!

**<u>Reflection</u>**: Today is the first Sunday of Lent. The season of Lent provides us with an opportunity to grow in the awareness of our unworthiness as sinners. Additionally, it is a time of preparation towards the celebration of the great feast of Easter. Therefore, the Church calls us to renew our covenant with God. The first reading recounts the covenant between God and Noah who represents humanity. This is a covenant of renewal and restoration sealed with a rainbow as a sign of God's faithfulness thus: "Here is a sign of the covenant I make between myself and you...I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the covenant." Unfortunately, humanity has been unfaithful to God and his covenant. That is why Lent is a season of grace which offers us opportunity to renew our covenant with God through Christ.

The gospel narrates the temptation of Jesus. To be a worthy lamb of God to save us, Jesus had to be tested. In the same manner, we are not immune from temptation which is inevitable. In fact, God allows it and through it, we prove our love and faith for Him. However, we should not be frightened because the Holy Spirit that helped Christ is always available to help us. To overcome, we must persist in prayer, fasting and alms giving which are the three pillars of Lent. May we see this Lenten season as a moment of spiritual renewal and shed off our old self and grow new life in Christ. Have a spirit-filled Lenten season!
