5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B 4th February 2024

READINGS: 1. Job 7:1-4.6-7 2. Corinthians 9:16-19.22-23; Gospel Mark 1:29-39. Response to Psalm Ps 146:1-6. Praise the Lord who heals the broken hearted. Gospel Acclamation; Alleluia! Alleluia! I am the light of the world, says the Lord, anyone who follows me will have the light of life. Alleluia!

<u>Reflection</u>: Today, the Church invites us to praise God who heals the broken hearted and who is close to those who suffer. She reminds us that without the healing power of Christ, we would have been in perpetual hopelessness. The first reading presents us with the dilemma of Job, an innocent and faithful servant of God who suffered humiliation, sickness, lost of wealth and betrayals, etc. The story should not leave us with the image of pity and misery, rather should raise our trust in the saving power of God. Job's faith was severely tested by the devil, he lost everything and was inflicted with leprosy. In spite of all, he did not lose faith in the saving power of God.

The story of Job reminds us of our own daily struggles with problems like sickness, hardships and betrayals etc. Also, it reminds us of what seems as: "The silence of God or the dark nights." These moments can make us wonder: "God, where are you, or, what have I done wrong?" These questions are normal and they show we are human. However they are also testing moments of our love and faith in God. If we stand firm, God will surely show us his saving power. Job later realised this and said: "Now I know that my Redeemer liveth." (Job 19:25) Also, the psalmist says: "though sorrow may endure for a night but joy comes in the morning." My brethren, God will not abandon you because He says: "even if a mother forgets her nursing baby, I will not forget you." So, no matter what are the reports or odds against you. All you need is patience, hope and faith in Jesus who is able to deliver those who trust in Him. God Loves You!
