## Second Sunday in Lent, Year B 25th February 2024

READINGS: 1. Genesis 22;1-2.9-13.15-18 2. St Paul to the Romans 8:31-34; Gospel Mark 9:2-10. Response to Psalm Ps 115:10.15-19. I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living. Gospel Acclamation; Glory and praise to you, O Christ! From the bright cloud the Father's voice was heard: 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him!' Glory and praise to you, O Christ!

<u>Reflection</u>: The Transfiguration of Jesus on Mount Tabor took place at a critical moment in the life of Jesus. He was on his way to Jerusalem where violent death was awaiting him. He had warned his disciples that, 'He was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day.' When Peter objected, Jesus rebuked him harshly: "Get behind me Satan! You are an obstacle on my path'. Therefore, it is right to say that suffering and death is integral to the salvific mission of Jesus Christ.

The Transfiguration experience was remarkable also for the disciples. They saw a glimpse of Jesus in his glory and their ears heard the divine confirmation of Jesus' identity as 'beloved Son' to whom they were commanded to listen to. Hence captivated by the experience, Peter wished to remain on the mountain but Jesus would not allow that because the way to the glory is through the Cross. The experience is remarkable in the life of the disciples in two ways. (1) It reinforced the faith of the disciples in Jesus as the Messiah which made them witnesses. Peter proclaimed thus: "we ourselves heard this voice from heaven when we were with Him on the mountain. Therefore, we firmly believe in the message of the Prophets." (2) This experience gave them the courage to endure persecution for the sake of Christ, because, the glory that lay ahead surpasses all sufferings. Therefore Child of God, learn to see your sufferings and trials as stepping stones to heavenly glory. Have a Spirit-filled Lenten Season!
