4th Sunday of Easter, Year B 21st April 2024

READINGS: 1. Acts 4:8-12 2. First John 3:1-2 Gospel John 10:11-18. <u>Response to Psalm</u> Ps 117:1.8-9.21-23.26.28-29. The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone. <u>Gospel Acclamation</u>; Alleluia, Alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me. Alleluia!

<u>Reflection</u>: Today, the fourth Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates Christ as the Good Shepherd. Do you know the peace and security of the Good Shepherd who watches over his own sheep? The Old Testament often speaks of God as Shepherd of his people, thus, "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want" (Psalm 23). "We are his people, and the Sheep of his pasture. (Psalm 100:3). Jesus says today, He is the Good Shepherd, who lays down his life to seek out and save the stray sheep. Therefore, Good Shepherd implies that there are many who are bad Shepherds. This Jesus warns thus: "The hired man, since he is not the Shepherd...abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees the wolf coming." This is a warning for us to be careful of some of the people of God and miracle centres who indulge in milking the gullible sheep for their own benefits and leading the sheep astray.

Jesus made three promises to his followers. He promised them everlasting life. If they accept him and follow him, they will have the life of God in them. Also, He promised them a life that would know no end and nothing would snatch them out of his hand, as a result, our lives are safe in his hands. Jesus is not claiming to be an expert in animal husbandry; rather, He claims to have a special loving relationship with his flock. Since as sheep, we are weak and need guidance to enjoy the good things of life and to reach our destination; therefore, in the uncertainties and confusions of life, be careful regarding the voices/ peoples suggesting solutions; rather, follow the voice of the Good Shepherd who will lead you to a greener pasture. Have a Blessed Good Shepherd Sunday!
