THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

10th January 2021

Fr Brian writes....



With an additional lockdown we are legally required to **STAY AT HOME** to help save lives and prevent the NHS being overwhelmed, as a result of the exponential spread of the virus. As with all admonitions there are exceptions. It is pleasing that one of the exceptions is for people of faith to gather for communal worship, subject to COVID-19 arrangements in their respective places of worship. For Catholics this means that, for the time being, Mass continues to be celebrated with a congregation. Each of us needs to make a personal assessment of risk as to whether it is safe for us to leave home and enter the church, even though a routine of cleaning and disinfection, social distancing and increased ventilation is in place. Where this is not possible all our Masses are livestreamed so that there can be some degree of participation in the highest form of prayer and worship known to Christians. The removal of the Sunday obligation has meant that nobody should feel guilty if they do not attend Mass. If you do intend to come to Mass, online booking is necessary please. You can make a booking via the parish website. To accommodate an increasing number of funerals there will be times that Mass is not available on a day it would normally be celebrated. I would ask you please not to attend funeral Masses if you hear of one, unless you have been personally invited by the next of kin. We are legally required to limit numbers at funerals to 30. Please pray at home amongst your families for an end of the spread of the virus and the distribution of the vaccine. The bishops have stated that it is morally acceptable to take the vaccine on the grounds of the Common Good. As well as participating in a livestreamed Mass, place the Word of God, your family Bible, in a prominent place in the home and read it with your spouse and your children. As much as the tabernacle in our churches contains the living body of Christ, the Bible in your home contains the living Word made flesh, who came and dwelt amongst us. We live in a fallen world that is subject to sin and its effects. The virus itself is part of this mystery of iniquity. Today's feast helps us to see beyond this depressing fact of a fallen and broken world, as it shows us through the descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus at his baptism that something new is beginning through the baptism and ministry of Jesus. It is the beginning of a re-creation of the world in which Jesus won the victory over the works of the Evil One in the Garden of Eden. We should rejoice in what God did for us in Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit as the victory over sin, suffering and death has been won. What we experience now as we struggle for justice and peace in exercising the preferential option for the poor and fight against the virus are, from a supernatural perspective the effects of a 'mopping up' exercise. Victory has been won! That's why as Christians we can never despair or give way to worry 'like the pagans', because as Jesus gets down into the waters of the River Jordan for his baptism, God gets down into the circumstances of our daily lives to lift us up in his good time.

Banning of Nuclear Weapons Officially Ratified: There is a call going out to churches to make a point of celebrating a special day January 22nd 2021. This is the day when the United Nations new treaty banning nuclear weapons is officially ratified, following the agreement of 50 nations having already signed this treaty. Our morning Mass on that day will be offered for World Peace. Churches are encouraged to consider ringing their bells on this day. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass will be offered as it is the greatest act of religious subversion and resistance to the powers and principalities that rule this world and wish to inflict great harm on us through the proliferation and use of nuclear weapons.
