

Gospel Reading: Mark 1:21-28

Fr Brian writes...



This week we have been presented with the grim statistic of over 100, 000 deaths as a result of COVID-19. Related to this will be bereaved families and friends who may not have had a chance to say goodbye. We remember all the bereaved at Mass during the Eucharist Prayer, especially at the increased number of funeral Masses being celebrated. There is also the effect of the lockdown on people's mental health and general well-being. In addition, the world also seems to be a more fractious place, certainly in the United States of America with a change of presidency and ongoing discussion in some quarters about the legitimacy of the election. The difficulties in the USA have seeped into the Catholic Church, with bishop against bishop and the gathering of different groups on the liberal vs conservative spectrum, often played out aggressively and uncharitably on social media about the role of the Church in the world and belief in doctrine. All this speaks of division, rebellion, enslavement and oppression, the complete opposite to the liberation that Jesus came to bring us. That's why in today's gospel reading the good news is that Jesus, with authority, sets us free from the evil influences that often dominate our lives, and that would lead us away from God, in the power of the demonic forces of the world. In the prescientific age of Jesus' time, all illnesses were understood to be manifestations of evil and sinfulness. Our modern understanding of illness is very different. Possession by unclean spirits may have been a way to describe what we might call extreme mental illness today. It may have even been a way of describing certain kinds of physical conditions. However, we cannot reduce the actions of the encounters of Jesus with the possessed to merely healing encounters. That is to take a reductionist view of Scripture. It is certainly not the teaching of the Church, which is clearly outlined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church <https://bit.ly/3qYf6qS> and why the Church provides the Ministry of Exorcist through selected priests specifically authorised by the bishop to pray the prayers contained in the Rite of Exorcism. Anyone experiencing spiritual affliction should contact me for assistance, as there is much I can do to help. Full possession is very rare, but the influence of the demonic can be troubling and irritating, almost like a pesky fly that we need to swipe away! But equally we should not assume that the devil and his demons are everywhere at work! That would be somewhat superstitious. For all of us, living a Catholic life of faith is sufficient to resist the work of the Evil One, unless we are reckless and introduce into our lives practices and beliefs that are not consistent with our faith. The good news of today's gospel is that Jesus is the Holy One of God who completely destroys evil, in our lives and in the world. His timescale is different – but he is definitely at work!

An update on Climate Change issues...

COP 26: The 2021 United nations Climate Change Summit (Conference of the Parties) is due to be held in Glasgow this November. It was postponed from last year and will be hosted by the UK and Italy jointly. This is the most important summit since the Paris Accord of 2015. Its goal was to limit global warming to well below 2, preferably to 1.5 degrees Celsius, compared to pre-industrial levels. Joe Biden, on his first day in Office, signed the USA up (again) to the agreement following then President Trump's withdrawal in 2017. There is now a mood of optimism that COP 26 will result in strong commitments to Climate Change with China and many European countries already sensing urgency and bringing forward Net Carbon neutral target dates.
