## Background to the Gospel Reading. Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cured Simon's mother-in-law, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and his disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As is common throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present. On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was found by Simon and others who brought news that many people were looking for him. Jesus reports to his disciples that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places. We see in this brief passage of Scripture, Jesus getting on with the work the Father has tasked him with; healing, exorcising the demonic and preaching, never settling. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness. The Rite of Exorcism (a sacramental) expels demonic influences that may have possessed an individual. In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of [prayer](#) in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives. Do we make time in our busy and distracted lives just like Jesus?

When you have completed the form and the accompanying request form, they should be posted through the Presbytery letterbox at 186 St Johns Road. Please note that I only sign Certificates of Catholic Practice for practising Catholics who attend **weekly** Sunday Mass (with exceptions for sickness, emergencies etc) in the parish of Hemel West and also, if you attended Sunday Mass regularly prior to the lockdown. Scouts earned the *Community Impact* badge by following the steps "Learn, Act and Tell" in their social justice action to combat homelessness and champion mental wellbeing. Homelessness is frequently linked to poor mental health; alongside DENS, MIND is one of The Scouts' charity partners. Scouting nowadays is less about "Dyb! Dyb! Dyb!" and more about equipping young people with skills for life.
