**Gospel Reading** *John 2:13-25*

**Fr Brian writes...**

You may have seen an article in the news this week that Pontins, the holiday park operator, had circulated a blacklist telling its staff not to book accommodation for people with certain Irish surnames, as they were considered “Undesirable Guests.” One of the blacklisted surnames was McMahon! Oh, well, perhaps Butlins might let me in this summer! Having read the gospel passage for this Sunday’s Mass, I wonder if Jesus might also end up on the Pontin’s blacklist after his behaviour in the Temple at Jerusalem. Imagine you were going about your business in the Temple at Jerusalem and encountered Jesus in full flow. How might you react? Jesus overturns the tables of the merchants and the moneychangers in the Temple at Jerusalem. At the time of Jesus worship at the Temple in Jerusalem included animal sacrifice, and merchants sold animals to worshippers. Moneychangers exchanged Roman coins, which bore the image of the Roman emperor, for the temple coins that were needed to pay the temple tax. After clearing the Temple of the merchants and the moneychangers, John’s Gospel tells us that the people asked for a sign of Jesus’ authority to do such an audacious act. In response, Jesus predicted his death and Resurrection. The language of signs is distinctive and John uses this word rather than miracles. These signs are proof of his authority. Jesus really does what it says on the tin! Here we learn that the supreme sign will be Jesus’ passion, death, and Resurrection, which we are preparing to celebrate during Holy Week, as we progress through Lent. During this liturgical season we reflect upon the meaning of this sign for us and for our world. We might take this opportunity to consider the quality of our prayer and worship. In our prayers we seek to deepen our relationship with the person of Christ. In our worship with the community, we gather to experience anew the passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus and its significance in our lives. Christ promises to be present with us when we gather for prayer.

## **Sacrament of Reconciliation**

Just a reminder that confessions are being heard on Friday evenings between 7pm-8pm in the presbytery. Why not pop in when you are out for your daily exercise? A screen is in place to facilitate penitent anonymity. Please wear a mask. I’m also available to hear confessions by appointment at other times. Jesus is waiting there in the Sacrament of Reconciliation for you. Pope Francis’ prayer intention for the month of March is for a renewed experience of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. When was the last time you went to confession he asks?

## Preparing for the New Normal

The COVID19 vaccination programme, coupled with infection control measures will, at some time in the future, bring the number of cases of coronavirus down to a level when we can resume a full programme of weekend and weekday Masses. With this in mind, Fr Brian has asked me, Deacon Simon, to begin preparations for that time, by refreshing our lists of people who are prepared to help. We will need Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Stewards, Little Church leaders and helpers, etc. If we are to provide the engaging liturgies that we were used to before the Corona Virus. If you've never served in this way before, now is an opportunity to come forward. The first list I want to compile is the list of the housebound who wish to receive Holy Communion. Although we have some names please do not assume that the list includes your loved one. To this end if you know of someone who used to receive Holy Communion prior to lockdown or someone who would like to receive Holy Communion, when home visits are safe enough to resume then please email me at [simonwright@rcdow.org.uk](mailto:simonwright@rcdow.org.uk) or phone 01442 391 759 and speak to Shirley or leave a message. Please include your name and contact details as well as the name of the person who would like to receive Holy Communion with their contact details and their residential address. All personal information is held on GDPR compliant secure servers.

## Baptisms

In order to comply with the current regulations, we can only hold a baptism during a scheduled Mass. Traditionally baptisms are not celebrated during Lent. Therefore, there will be no baptisms in church until after Easter. However, we have now received guidance from our Bishop's on how the new regulations and guidance from the government (on the relaxation of the current lockdown) affects Church services. Baptisms outside of Mass will not resume until 17<sup>th</sup> May at the earliest, and possibly later if the infection data takes a turn for the worst. Therefore, if you have attended a Baptism Preparation Class and you live within the parish of Hemel West you can book one of the following Sunday Masses, via the events page, for a baptism on: 18/25 April and 2/9 and 16 May.
