*Fr Brian writes...*

Today's Gospel describes what might well have been the usual routine of Jesus's daily life and characterised his ministry; teaching in the synagogue followed by acts of healing. In his hometown of Nazareth, the people are amazed by what they hear, but they also cannot comprehend how someone they know so well might move them so powerfully. He would have been completely familiar to them.

We learn a little biographical detail about Jesus in this extract from Mark's Gospel. Jesus was known as a carpenter, an artisan who worked in wood, stone, and metal. He probably learned this trade from his father, Joseph. If there were white vans in his time – he would probably have driven one! The family members of Jesus are also named. Mark describes Jesus as the son of Mary, which is an unusual designation. Adult males were more typically identified with the name of their fathers. Brothers and sisters of Jesus are also named. Scholars are divided on how to interpret this. As Catholics, we believe that Mary was and remained always a virgin, thus we do not believe that this Gospel refers to other children of Mary. Some have suggested that these family members might be Joseph's children from a previous marriage, but there is little evidence to support this. Others explain this reference by noting that the words *brother* and *sister* were often used to refer to other types of relatives, including cousins, nieces, and nephews.

This Gospel tells us that Jesus is hampered from performing miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith. Jesus is said to be surprised by this. He did not predict or foresee this rejection. In this detail we find a description of the very human side of Jesus. By showing that Jesus himself was rejected, Mark consoles and reassures his first readers. He also prepares us to accept this possible consequence of Christian discipleship. What about us? Are we prepared to be rejected for our faith? Or do we compromise ourselves with the increasing degree of secularism we experience today, by an underplaying of the supernatural elements of our faith and acceptance of social mores, many of which are contrary to the moral teaching of the Church?

### Baptism

As part of the gradual relaxing of restrictions, we can now have baptisms on a Saturday, however there are still conditions. Firstly, previous attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is required for the first child and, if you are not a weekly Mass attender, any subsequent children. If you attend Mass weekly and it is less than three years since you attended a baptism preparation class then re-attendance of the class is highly recommended particularly as your contributions to the discussions will be valuable for new parents. In addition, at each baptism we can only baptise a child/children from the same parents. The maximum attendance is limited to 30 people which includes the child/children being baptised but we will live stream the baptism for those who, for whatever reason, do not attend. Track and trace still apply so attendees must register for the event.

**Baptism Preparation Class:** The next on-line Baptism Preparation Classes will be on 10<sup>th</sup> August and 12<sup>th</sup> August from 7:30pm until 9.30pm. Baptisms typically take place on the morning of the first Saturday of the month except for Lent, December and August. **Reflection**

Isaiah 11:2

Isaiah speaks of what we might think of as God's vision for the world. As followers of Jesus, we are called to notice those who are marginalised by things such as poverty, illness, grief, racism, or injustice, and to act with mercy, caring for the whole person in Jesus's name. As we do God's work, the spirit of God shall rest also on us.
