## Fr Brian writes...

### **STAY AWAKE!**

Today is the first Sunday of Advent, which is also the first Sunday of the new liturgical year, so Happy New Year! Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith: the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of the Lord in the birth of Jesus. The key themes of the Advent season are watchful waiting, preparation, and justice. Today we hear Jesus speak to his disciples about the need for vigilance and prayer as they wait for the coming of the Son of Man in glory. This passage marks the conclusion of a lengthy dialogue in which Jesus predicts the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, warns about the persecution and tribulations to follow, and identifies the signs that will signal the coming of the Son of Man in glory. Though Jesus predicts a time of destruction and fear, Jesus indicates that others will be frightened; Jesus' disciples are not to fear, but are to stand tall. Yet Jesus does not promise deliverance from anxiety or tribulations. He encourages his disciples to pray for strength. Jesus' predictions about the end times may sound dire, but in the next paragraph Luke tells us that people woke early to listen to Jesus' teaching in the Temple area. In his person and in his message, those who heard Jesus found strength and consolation and no doubt heeded his warnings about the risks of taking their 'eye off the ball' if not living as God invites us to do. Like the first Christians, we may encounter events and circumstances that could lead us to despair. Through prayer, however, we find strength and consolation in Jesus' words and in his continuing presence with us to endure all things and to witness to the action of God in our world, as a people of hope. Come, Lord Jesus, Come!

SICK & RETIRED PRIEST'S FUND: There are more CWL charitable funds. than 80 sick and retired priests who receive support after a lifetime of service to parishes across the diocese. By 2025 the number of priests in retirement is set to double, at time when vocations to the priesthood are declining and active priests are being asked to do more, such as when parishes are merged or paired. Most priests offer their resignation as a parish priest at the age of 75, but many continue to serve in a limited way in our parishes, schools, hospices, and hospitals. At this time, they are dependent on the Diocese for their care – for essentials like housing, any health needs and other essentials. Parish priests are supported directly from parish funds by way of a monthly stipend and the upkeep of the presbytery. Sick and retired priests have given a life time of service through administering the sacraments and in other ways. They have given to us all and now, in their old age or sickness, they need us to give back. By giving to the Sick &

Retired Priests' Fund, you can ensure our priests are cared for. You can take a donation envelope as you leave Church today, but the envelopes and posters also feature a 'QR Code' that you can scan with a phone camera to give online, reducing the risks to everyone of handling cash. Please continue to pray for all our clergy: active, retired or ill.
