TODAY'S MASS

Father, may they be completely one

Fr Brian writes...

Pentecost, the end of the Easter season, and is next Sunday. The Paschal Candle which has been lit during all liturgical celebrations since the Easter Vigil, is removed from the sanctuary only to appear again at baptisms and funerals. Ordinary time kicks- in with the wearing of green Mass vestments. Today's readings remind us that, like the first apostles and disciples, we must let ourselves be shaped by the Word and his Spirit. In addition to the Ten Commandments given by God to Moses as found in the Old Testament (Exodus 20:2-17 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21) that oblige Jews and Christians to this very day, the Catholic Church has established its own set of particular commandments or "precepts" that bind the baptised Catholic faithful. We call these requirements the Precepts of the Church. If you like, they are the 'rules of the club.' The Precepts of the Church describe the minimum effort we must make in prayer and in living a moral life. All Catholics are called to move beyond the minimum by growing in love of God and love of neighbour.

The Precepts of the Church are as follows:

- 1.Attendance at Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labour
- 2. Confession of sin at least once a year
- 3. Reception of Holy Communion at least during the Easter season
- 4. Observance of the days of fast and abstinence
- 5. Providing for the needs of the Church

As we approach Pentecost, the birth of the Church in wind and fire with the descent of the Holy Spirit, it's a good opportunity to ask ourselves how we are doing in regards to being Catholics. The Precepts of the Church can assist us by marking us out in terms of our witness as "called out of darkness." 1 Peter 2:9-10
