TODAY'S MASS

The Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Fr Brian writes....

Today is the first Sunday of Advent, which is also the first Sunday of a new liturgical year for the Church. The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas. It is a time of preparation for the coming of the Lord. In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith: the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of the Lord in the birth of Jesus. Key themes of the Advent season are watchful waiting, preparation, and justice. In this new liturgical year, the Gospel of Matthew will be the primary Gospel proclaimed (Lectionary Cycle A). In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus speak about the need for wakefulness, for watchful waiting, for the coming of the Son of Man.

The passage from Matthew we read today is rather straightforward. No one knows the precise time of the coming of the Lord in glory, so watchful waiting and vigilance are required. The passage speaks to the uselessness of looking for signs; there will be none. As a thief sneaks in during the night, so will the Lord's coming in glory be.

Today's passage speaks more about the manner of waiting, rather than the details of the preparation. Jesus compares the vigilance required of Christians to the vigilance of a homeowner who knows the plans of the thief. If one knows that the thief's action is imminent, one remains watchful. As Christians, we know that our Lord is coming even if we cannot know the precise timing. Jesus calls us to be watchful and vigilant, like the homeowner. If we become lax in our Christian living, we may be caught unprepared. Charity must take us forward in thought, word and deed. As we prepare for the coming of Christmas, these reflections by Jan Such-Pickard, a poet and storyteller living in the Isle of Mull and a member of the ecumenical Iona Community, may be stimulating. Thanks to the cross-parish J&P Group for sharing. Iona Community Members have written and published reflections on Israel-Palestine in an "Advent Calendar", one for each day of Advent. FIRE DRILL IN DECEMBER: Get ready for a fire drill on the 3/4 December at the end of all Masses! When you hear the alarm sound, leave the church calmly but immediately via the nearest fire exit, not stopping to collect any items. Please do not re-enter the church once you have left, but disperse from the area around exits, avoiding bottlenecks, to allow people behind you to get out of the church to a place of safety. This is a necessary exercise to fulfil our legal duty of care under fire safety legislation. We are aiming to utilised. Do remember to send the second half of completely evacuate the church within 2 minutes PARISH FUEL FUND - Assistance for parishioners:
