TODAY'S MASS

How Jesus Christ came to be born

The "O Antiphons" of Advent

Fr Brian writes....

The Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the Magnificat canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They use ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfilment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah. The "O" Antiphons are the verses for the ancient hymn O Come, O Come Emmanuel. The first letter of the Messianic titles: Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia—spell out Latin words ERO CRAS, meaning, "Tomorrow, I will come." I encourage you to make them part of your personal prayer in this remaining week of Advent. One day He will come again in glory. STAY AWAKE!

O Sapientia or O Wisdom of our God Most High,

guiding creation with power and love:

come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18

O Adonai or O Lord and Ruler of the House of Israel,

giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai:

come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19

O Radix Jesse or O Root of Jesse's stem,

sign of God's love for all his people:

come to save us without delay!

December 20

O Clavis David or O Key of David

opening the gates of $\operatorname{\mathsf{God's}}$ eternal $\operatorname{\mathsf{Kingdom}}$:

come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21

O Oriens or O Rising Dawn or Morning Star

splendor of eternal light, sun of justice:

come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22

O Rex Gentium or O King of the Nations

keystone of the Church:

come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23

O Emmanuel

our King and Giver of Law:

come to save us, Lord our God!

- 1) "After having read and prayed with the DCS, which intuitions resonate most strongly with the lived experiences and realities of the Church in your continent? Which experiences are new, or illuminating to you?"
- 2) "After having read and prayed with the DCS, what substantial tensions or divergences emerge as particularly important in your continent's perspective? Consequently, what are questions or issues that should be addressed and considered in the next steps of the process?"
- 3) "Looking at what emerges from the previous two questions, what are the priorities, recurring themes and calls to action that can be shared with other local Churches around the world and discussed during the First Session of the Synodal Assembly in October 2023?"
