'This is my Son, the Beloved'



Gospel Matthew 3:13-17

Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John. John tried to dissuade him. 'It is I who need baptism from you' he said 'and yet you come to me!' But Jesus replied, 'Leave it like this for the time being; it is fitting that we should, in this way, do all that righteousness demands.' At this, John gave in to him.

As soon as Jesus was baptised he came up from the water, and suddenly the heavens opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming down on him. And a voice spoke from heaven, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him.'

THANK YOU! A Big Thank You to everyone who played a part in preparing our churches for the celebration of Christmas and contributed to the prayerful and joyful celebration of our Masses. It was very encouraging to see over several hundred people in Church over Christmas. Thank you also for your generosity in the Offertory Collections. As you may be aware at Christmas and Easter this collection is not subject to the usual 'diocesan assessment' percentage that the diocese takes on a weekly basis, but is retained in the parish to contribute towards paying the priest's annual taxable stipend of £9,900, so thank you!

STATUE OF THE BLESSED VIGIN MOTHER OUTSIDE THE CHURCH: As many of you may be aware a person or persons unknown smashed our statue of the Blessed Mother to bits over the weekend. It was very securely attached to its plinth and would have required deliberate force to remove it. A Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary was offered on Wednesday morning as an act of reparation for the blasphemy of 'The Offenses of Those Who Directly Outrage Her in Her Holy Images.' Evil cannot triumph where our Blessed Mother is concerned. Many local people have expressed their disgust at this blasphemous act of vandalism. I intend to build back better! Watch this space...

MARY'S MEALS COLLECTION: Mary's Meals would like to thank everyone in the parish for their wonderful generosity. We spoke at the end of each Mass last weekend and were delighted by the total given – a terrific £680.90! This will feed whole year. However, our 'Double the Love' campaign means all donations (up to £1.5 million

before 31 January 2023) will be matched so the parish effectively doubles the number of children being fed from 41 to 82! Please continue to pray for our work. God bless you all.

PEACE SUNDAY: Next Sunday, 15 January, is PEACE SUNDAY and this year the message from Pope Francis tells us: 'No one can be saved alone. He asks us: 'What did we learn from the pandemic? What new paths should we follow to cast off the shackles of our old habits, to be better prepared, to dare new things? What signs of life and hope can we see, to help us move forward and try to make our world a better place?' A vaccine has been found for Covid-19, says the Holy Father, but we still need to tackle the virus of war, and of inequality, and this can only be done together. In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi, which aims at working together to promote peace through parishes, schools and social media.
