TODAY'S MASS

Do not be afraid of those who kill the body



Fr Brian writes....

Do read for yourself the latest output from the Synod at the link: https://shorturl.at/iCNQ5. I have left a couple of copies at the back of the Boxmoor church for you to read through and prepare for the world -wide opening of the Synod in October in Rome. By convoking this Synod, Pope Francis is inviting all the baptised to participate in this Synodal Process that begins at the diocesan level. The main subjects of this synodal experience are all the baptised because all the baptised are the subject of the sensus fidelium, the living voice of the People of God.

At the same time, in order to participate fully in the act of discerning, it is important for the baptised to hear the voices of other people in their local context, including people who have left the practice of the faith, people of other faith traditions, people of no religious belief. Special care should be taken to involve those persons who may risk being excluded: women, the disabled, refugees, migrants, the elderly, people who live in poverty, Catholics who rarely or never practice their faith, etc.

As a parish we began this process, though it was rushed and consequently the Church extended the discussion period. I'm not sure all the key groups were involved as we were given little time to engage people. However, our discussions were sent to the diocese who forwarded it to Rome to be part of contributions from the global Church.

Appetite for the Synod seems not particularly strong in this country, so we shall see what occurs during the next year or so, though acceptance and resistance of change will begin and outlast many of us! We will have more gatherings to discuss the outcomes from the Synod as the years go by and more importantly put changes in place, inspired by the Holy Spirit!

SS PETER & PAUL: Thursday 29 June, is a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be Mass at Ss Mary & Joseph at 10am.

DAY FOR LIFE COLLECTON: The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. In England and Wales, Day for Life is celebrated on the third Sunday of June each year. This year it falls on 17/18 June. For the first time, it will be celebrated in Scotland and Ireland on the same day. The theme is 'Listen to Her' and focuses on post-abortion trauma and the impact of abortion primarily on women, but also men and others. Each year a message is released, usually by the Church's Lead Bishop for Life Issues, offering a reflection on the year's theme. The 2023 message is unique in that the bishops' have given it over to a Catholic woman who has had an abortion to share her experiences. Often the voices of women who have had an abortion are silent in Church and in society. The hope is that this will help break this silence and offer further opportunities for healing and reconciliation. There will be a collection this weekend for Day for Life.
