# TODAY'S MASS

Unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority

...and they were astonished at his teaching for he taught them as one who had authority...

#### Mark 1.22

"What does 'with authority' mean?" — asks Pope Francis - "It means that in the human word of Jesus the strength of the Word of God was felt, the same authoritativeness of God, the inspirer of the Holy Scripture, was felt. And one of the characteristics of the Word of God is that it carries out that which it says. ... He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him. The word of God astonishes us with that strength. It really astonishes us. The Gospel is the word of life: it does not oppress people, on the contrary, it frees those who are enslaved by so many evil spirits in this world: vanity, the attachment to money, pride, sensuality...The Gospel changes the heart! It changes life; it transforms the inclination to evil to resolutions of good. The Gospel is capable of changing the hearts of the people. Always remember that the Gospel has the power to change life! Do not forget this! That is the good news that transforms us when we allow ourselves to be transformed by it!"

Who Jesus is unmistakable to the man possessed by an unclean spirit. To say that he was uncomfortable is an understatement. The Word of God, present before him, astounded him. He recognised the Lord Jesus, the creator of the universe. The word of Jesus, spoken with authority saved him. New life begins in the man. We too, each one of us, is called into new life, called forth, n some way to be delivered from the things that get us stuck in ourselves and our obsessions.

The fathers of the Second Vatican Council reminded us that "when the holy scriptures are read in Church, it is Christ himself who speaks". (Sacrosanctum Concilium 7). So we stand when the ordained minister gives voice to the words of Jesus, alert, longing to welcome words spoken into us to bring us new life. For his words – as it was at the dawn of Creation accomplish what he says. There is a staggering immediacy.

The Lord Jesus gave his authority to his Church. He declared that all authority in heaven and on earth had been given to him. Go make disciples, baptizing them.... (Matt 28.18-20). In his authority, with boldness, the church continues to call people to Jesus, to baptise and teach. When she does so, it is Jesus in our midst speaking and baptising. He has a claim on each person. He gave his authority in a particular way to Peter whose successor continues to protect the deposit of faith and guide the Church for the salvation of souls. He gave his authority to the Apostles, to our Bishops as their successors, so that they can continue to teach with Jesus' authority.

And each of us has the opportunity of encountering the Word of God ourselves in the gospels in prayer, person to person. How is the Lord longing to bring you new life? How is he the Author of new life for you?
