

27th June 2021 - 13th Sunday of Ordinary Time



We are now in the 13th Sunday in Ordinary time. The gospel this Sunday draws us to reflect upon how we approach God in our life. The two persons in the gospel showed a good example for all of us to imitate in life. On one hand, the synagogue official sought Jesus for his ill and dying daughter, on the other hand, the woman with haemorrhage sought Jesus to heal her from her long years of pain. Both approached Jesus and believed that only Jesus can grant their hearts desire. They approached Him not just with faith but most of all with great humility. The official went to Jesus on bended knees to ask His help whilst the woman continually prayed in her heart that if she could only touch even the cloak of Jesus she would be healed. With humility and faith, they were able to touch the heart of Jesus to give heed to their prayers and through this disposition, the daughter of the official was brought back to

life and the woman was healed and freed from her pain after 12 years of painful agonies.

The gospel today is calling us that in our prayer we come to Him with great humility and with great faith either when we pray for someone or when we pray to Him to ask His guidance and help. Of course, our God knows what we need in our life. He knows our own struggles in life, our difficulties, our situations in life, and the many things we are undergoing at this moment. But we are called as His sons and daughters, in Christ, that we go to Him with the humility and recognition that without Him we are powerless and poor and with the faith that it is only Him who can grant our hearts desires, that He is our hope, that He can heal us, that He can strengthen and that he can lift us up from our pains and maladies in life. Let us imitate the disposition of the heart of the two persons in the gospel today as we approach God in our prayers. And when everything seems to be hopeless let us always remember the words of Jesus: "Do not be afraid, only have faith!"

CHURCH OCCUPANCY: Due to the surge of the new variants in Hounslow we are now in a position to reduce once again the occupancy of our Church. We have been instructed to ensure a strict 2-meter distancing in between people of different households. This will be reviewed in due time according to instructions received both from the Diocese and from the Council.

VOCATIONIST CO-OPERATORS: In every Parish where we work, we have this kind of group which is a way to involve the laity, our parishioners into the work of the order and share with them our spirituality. The group aims to first and foremost pray for vocations, then to offer sacrifice for these and thirdly to help the Vocationist Family nurture them. CHURCH MINISTRIES: As the government has set out a roadmap out of lockdown, we too are planning our return to more normal parish life. With the Parish life being "on hold" for almost a year, many ministries and services which took place regularly have been stopped due to the pandemic; as we are planning our next step we would like all those who were involved in ministries like reading, choir, flowers, cleaning or those who would like to volunteer for any of these roles to make contact with the Parish Secretary.

USE OF FACE-MASKS: As you all know; the use of face masks is mandatory by law in places of worship unless one is exempt for health reasons. We have noticed recently quite some people removing masks during Mass, this not only poses a threat to your health and the health of people around you but also becomes a distraction for the clergy and also a disruption of Mass as stewards would need to address these people or the clergy need to remind the congregation to wear masks correctly. Please, when you come to Church remember to keep the masks on at all times and properly wear them.

ST PETER AND ST PAUL: On Tuesday 29 June we celebrate the solemnity of St Peter and St Paul. As per tradition on that day we give thanks to God for the gift of those children who attend The Rosary who have received their First Holy Communion this year, for this reason the morning Mass at 9:30 will be only for the children and staff from The Rosary, no one else will be allowed in. We have put another Mass at 7 pm for all parishioners who wish to attend Mass on such a special day.

SUNDAY OBLIGATION

The Sunday Obligation is still lifted, however, we understand that some people wish to attend Mass. If you are in a vulnerable category, even if vaccinated, think twice before exposing yourself to further risks and perhaps consider coming to a weekday Mass rather than a weekend.

CELEBRATION OF SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: Use the application online available through our website. Please give us two-month notice for your preferred date, the application will be added to a waiting list and the celebrations will follow the order in which these come in.

MARRIAGE: If you wish to get married in our Church we need between six and twelve-month notice for the date. If you need to do the paperwork this will be done six months before the wedding date. If your marriage is taking place abroad please enquire with the priest celebrating the marriage about documents needed and their validity, once we send the forms to the chancery we can no longer query them.
