7 MAY 2023 – 5th Sunday of Easter



The gospel for this Sunday offers comfort, guidance, and encouragement to us. This passage is part of Jesus' farewell discourse to his disciples before his crucifixion, and it contains some of the most beautiful and profound words that Jesus ever spoke. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me." No matter what challenges we may face in life, we can always find peace and comfort in our faith. We are called to trust in God and in Jesus, and to hold fast to that trust no matter what happens. Our ultimate home is with God in heaven. We are

called to strive for this heavenly home, to live our lives in a way that will allow us to be with God forever. "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Jesus is the path that we must follow if we want to be close to God. He is the truth that we must seek, and the life that we must live if we want to experience the fullness of God's love. We are called to continue Jesus' work in the world. We are called to love others, to serve others, and to bring God's light into the darkness of the world. Jesus describes himself as "the way, the truth, and the life." Through these words, he not only identifies himself as the one who can connect us to the Father, but also as a window into the community of the Trinity. His life and teachings demonstrate how we can live in harmony with God and one another. Jesus' focus was always on doing the will of the Father and benefiting all of humanity. The early Christian community took this message to heart, as demonstrated in Acts 6:1-7. They recognized the importance of caring for widows, and when it became clear that they were falling short in this responsibility, they appointed deacons to ensure that everyone was taken care of. This shows how the early Christians put Jesus' teachings into practice by caring for those in need and working together as a community. By following Jesus' example, we too can live in harmony with God and one another, and strive to make the world a better place for all.
