29th October 2023 – 30th SUNDAY OF THE ORDINARY TIME

The **First Reading** is taken from the *Book of Exodus* 22:20-26. These verses cover the Israelites' duties toward strangers (non-Israelites), widows and orphans and the poor in general. They are a practical application of the

law of charity in their dealings with their neighbours.

The **Second Reading** is from the *First Letter of St. Paul to the* Thessalonians 1:5c-10. St. Paul continues to praise the Thessalonians, not only for accepting the faith in difficult circumstances, but for the wonderful example their Christian life had already given to most of Greece.

The Gospel is from Matthew 22:34-40. The Pharisees may not have had evil intentions when asking Christ the question as to the greatest commandment. But they have done us a good service by getting this crystal-clear answer from him. In this answer he tells us that the man who loves God and neighbour fulfils all his obligations, and carries out all the duties that God's self-revelation in "the law and the prophets" imposes on him. God revealed himself to us in the Old Testament as our Creator and divine benefactor. He had no need of us, since he is infinitely perfect in himself, but out of his infinite goodness he wished to share his eternal kingdom of happiness with mankind and so he created us. That we should love such a benefactor and be grateful to him is not asking much of us; such love should surely be the spontaneous reaction of a rational being, and yet there were and there are many who fail to acknowledge any such obligation.

No Christian, worthy of the name, can ever be among such thoughtless and thankless people. We have greater proofs of God's love for us than "the law and the prophets" gave to the Israelites. We have the added proofs of God's infinite interest in us brought to us by the Incarnation. We have been raised to the sublime status of adopted sons of God.

Where Christians can, and too often do fail, is in their true love of neighbour. Yet Christ says that this commandment is like the first. Love of neighbour is an essential part of our obligations toward God. If we fail in this we fail in our love for God, for we refuse to carry out this sacred duty. If we do not recognize our neighbour as our brother, we do not recognize God as our Father and we do not love him. As St. John puts it: "Anyone who says 'I love God' and hates (does not love) his neighbour is a liar" (1 Jn.3: 20).

Let each one of us ask himself today how seriously he takes this law of fraternal charity and how faithfully he carries it out. Not all of us may be able to give material help to a neighbour in need but the poorest of us can spare a kindly word, an encouraging word, for a neighbour weighed down with cares and troubles. All of us can pray for a neighbour who needs spiritual and temporal help. Most of us can deny ourselves some unnecessary luxuries in order to give a needed loaf of bread to a hungry fellowman, while those who have an abundance of this world's goods need not look far afield to find cases and causes worthy of their Christian charity.

Remember that whatever spiritual or material help is given out of true charity to a neighbour in need, is given to God, and whatever is given to God is soundly invested in heaven, and heaven pays handsome dividends. -Excerpted from The Sunday Readings by Fr. Kevin O'Sullivan, O.F.M.

CHRISTMAS CHOIR: We are eight weeks away from the celebration of Christmas and we have already begun preparation and planning, especially with the choir. We want to make sure that the Midnight Mass of Christmas will be even more solemn through the music ministry. We are inviting all those who wish to join the choir for this occasion to speak to Sandra Thurley, John Isaac or the clergy.

When you come for your meeting please make sure you bring with you the Baptism Certificate of your child as well as the latest Mass Attendance Card, if your child has not been to Church regularly or often it will result in the form not being signed.

FIRE WARDENS: As part of our H&S requirements, we need to have Fire Wardens to help in case of evacuation. We need some people to help at any of the Masses. If you are willing to help please contact the Parish Office. Training will be offered to those who will be helping.

MINISTRY ROTA: The rota for Readers and Eucharistic Ministers is ready for collection. If you have not received it by email, you can get a copy from the back of the church.

BINGO NIGHT: Some parishioners have been asking for a while for Parish Bingo Night, unfortunately we were not able to find a suitable date before the Summer Holidays. However, we can now inform you that we have decided to organise on for Friday 10 November 7 pm for 7.30 pm start. £5 per book, snacks will be available for purchase during the break.

CHRISTMAS FAIR: We are holding our Christmas Fair on Saturday 9 December 12noon to 3 pm, and like past years, this is a joint effort with The Rosary Catholic Primary School. We are looking for donations of bottles for our Tombola and our Bottle Stall, as well as Toiletries Sets and any other donation. Please do not bring clothes, books, DVD or electrics without a PAT test or that are not brand new and sealed.

CONFIRMATIONS 2024: Applications for Confirmations will close on Monday 30 October at 9am. Those who have applied will receive an email from the Parish Office by the end of the week. There will be an introductory Parents' Meeting at 11am on Saturday 4 November in the Upstairs Hall at the back of the Church. This is a PARENT ONLY meeting; the candidates for Confirmation do not need to attend.

NOVEMBER MASSES: November is the month of the Holy Souls and many want to offer Masses for their loved ones. We only have 30 days in November and we have tried reserving Mass Intentions for the November lists people present, however some Masses have already been booked. We ask parishioners who intend to offer a Mass for family members who have passed away to offer it "For the deceased members of the xxx Family" so to allow others to offer theirs. In the coming weeks you will also find the envelopes for the November Lists.

BLESSING OF GRAVES: A calendar with dates of the blessing of graves within the deanery has now been published, you can find the time and dates of the Blessing for each cemetery.

MASS ATTENDANCE CARDS: Attendance cards for all children from 2 years of age up to year 5 is ready to be collected from the Parish Office. This is a tool to help priests signing School Forms and to ensure you are practicing Catholic; all parents are encouraged to get a card for their children, even those who are at Mass every weekend. Please remember to bring your old card so we can keep record of your child mass attendance.

VOLUNTEERS AND SKILLS AUDIT: We are running an audit to see how many among our parishioners are willing to volunteer and what skills and talents we have among us. This will not mean that you will need to volunteer

and offer your service immediately; it is just for the priests to know who is available and what talents they can rely on. Please return the form to the Parish Office through the letterbox.

VOTIVE CANDLES: Each stand has a lighter with it so please use it to light your candles and not use candles to light other candles, please also **refrain from taking candles around the Church**, especially lit candles as it poses a risk for yourself and others around you.

SACRAMENTS

BAPTISMS: Please use the form on the Parish Website to enquire about the Baptism for your child. We celebrate Baptisms on a Saturday only; we ask that you give us minimum 6 weeks' notice.

MARRIAGE: If you are planning on getting married we can only start the paperwork needed by the diocese 6 months prior your wedding day. Whether you are marrying in the UK or abroad we ask that you give us minimum 6 months' notice, especially if we need to arrange a marriage course. Please do not leave it to the last minute!
