



17th December 2023 – 3rd SUNDAY OF ADVENT (GAUDETE SUNDAY)



This Sunday's Gospel invites us to continue our reflection on the person and mission of John the Baptist. Today we depart from the Gospel of Mark and read a selection from the Gospel of John. The Gospel for today combines a brief passage from the prologue to John's Gospel with a report about John the Baptist. As in Mark's Gospel, the Gospel of John contains no birth narrative. Instead, John's Gospel begins with a theological reflection that has come to be called the "prologue." This prologue places the story of Jesus in its cosmological framework. It speaks of Jesus' existence with God since the beginning of time. In John's Gospel, Jesus is presented as the fulfilment of the Old Testament and the culmination of the Word, the light that is coming into the world's darkness. Following this prologue, John reports on the ministry of John the Baptist. We learn about the attention that John the Baptist received from the Jewish authorities. Messengers from the Jewish priests, the Levites and the

Pharisees question John about his identity and the meaning of the baptisms that he is performing. John's Gospel uses these questions to establish the relationship between Jesus and John the Baptist. John the Baptist is not the Messiah, nor is he Elijah or the Prophet. In John's denials, we hear echoes of the kind of messianic expectations that were common in first-century Palestine. The only affirmative response that John the Baptist gives is when he quotes the prophet Isaiah. Upon answering the next question, John announces that the saviour they seek is already among them, but as yet unrecognized. John's response highlights for us an important Advent theme: Jesus has already come into the world as our saviour. During Advent, we pray that we will be able to recognize Jesus' presence in our midst. Advent also reminds us that Jesus will come again to fulfil the promise of salvation. We pray that we will continue to be watchful as we anticipate that great day. The third Sunday of Advent is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete, a Latin word which means "rejoice," is taken from the entrance antiphon for Sunday's Mass. This theme is echoed in today's second reading from the first Letter to the Thessalonians. It is a reminder that Advent is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand.



Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife. 10. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's goods.

LITTERING: We have noticed that some people have a habit of leaving behind used tissues, please dispose of them on your way out or put them in your pocket and dispose of the them when home. It is a matter of respect, hygiene and common sense, do not leave your rubbish for other to clean.

SWITCH OFF YOUR PHONE: When you enter the Church, it may be possible that you hear "the call of God". However, it is unlikely that He will call you on your mobile. It may be a good exercise to switch it off or at least put it on silent before you enter the Church. If you want to talk to God, find a quiet place, pray and talk to Him.

SUNDAY OBLIGATION: This year, Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday and this means that it is the fourth Sunday of Advent. While the evening Masses are for the celebration of Christmas Eve, we still have the Sunday obligation and to fulfil it we need to attend the Sunday Mass either the morning or the vigil Mass on Saturday 23 December. The Masses on the evening of 24 December are not the Sunday Mass.

CHRISTMAS FAIR: Many thanks to all those who attended our Christmas Fair and to all those who have helped setting up and running stalls on the day. The total amount raised is £2,750.25; this will be divided with the Rosary Catholic Primary School.

CHRISTMAS CELEBRATIONS: Please refer to the programme for Mass times in the coming weeks.

ALTAR SERVERS: There will be Church Cleaning on Saturday 23 December at 10am, followed by rehearsals for those who will be serving at the Midnight Mass. On Tuesday 26 December we gather at 10am for the Mass of the renewal and enrolment. After the Mass we will gather for a moment of celebration in the Pope John Centre, please bring food or snacks to be shared with everyone!

THANK YOU! Heartfelt thanks to the Goan community who have donated £1000 from the proceeds of the Feast of St Francis Xavier towards a new Sanctuary Carpet. Together with the Finance Committee, we have decided to add to these the funds from the Christmas Fair. We will look at a new carpet in the New Year once the Church is redecorated. In addition, heartfelt thanks to a family within our Parish who sponsored our Christmas Tree this year. May God bless and reward your generosity!

CARITAS ADVENT CALENDAR: Caritas Westminster has prepared a different Advent Calendar that should help us think of those who are less fortunate or may be struggling at this moment. MASS INTENTIONS: We are now booking mass intentions for 2024 up until June.

FIRE WARDENS: We are looking for fire wardens to help us in case of an evacuation, the role only foresees that you would ensure the Church is evacuated promptly and people know where to assemble. Contact the Parish Office is you would like to offer this service, training will be provided.

PARKING: We are lucky to have a rather large car park, something that not all Churches can afford. When you come to Church, please use the Car Park entrance on Eton Avenue rather than parking outside the Church. Often, there are too many cars with some blocking the fire exit at the front making it difficult to have any activity outside the Church.

PILGRIMAGE TO ASSISI: We are looking into the possibility of arranging a Pilgrimage to Assisi, the town of St Francis and St Clare and where Blessed Carlo Acutis is buried, in April after the Easter holidays. The cost should be between £500 and £600, depending on accommodation and the programme we will follow. If you are interested, you can speak to the Parish Office or Gabriel Fernandes. Please note that the pilgrimage is not suitable for those who need assistance to walk, cannot walk long distances, uneven surfaces and steep streets as Assisi is a medieval town and roads can be very steep and not smooth.

VOTIVE CANDLES: Each stand has a lighter with it so please use it to light your candles and not use candles to light other candles, please also **refrain from taking candles around the Church**, especially lit candles as it poses a risk for yourself and others around you.


