



4th February 2024 – 5th Sunday of the Ordinary Time



[This Sunday] we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's motherin-law, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and his disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present. On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others who brought

news that many people were looking for him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role for the inner circle of Jesus' disciples—they act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to his disciples that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places. Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee. Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness. In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.

"The Penny Catechism" 8. HOLY COMMUNION

- **68.** How did our Lord show His special love for us! Our Lord showed His special love for us, by making Himself a food for our souls.
- 69. What do we call this heavenly food? We call this heavenly food Holy Communion (Holy Eucharist).70. What is Holy Communion? Holy Communion is the receiving of the Body and Blood of our Lord under the appearance of bread.
- **71. How often should we receive Holy Communion?** We should receive Holy Communion often, even daily if possible.

POLITE NOTICE – If your child becomes noisy and disruptive can you please take them to the room at the back of the church for the duration of the mass. Also, accompany the kneelers when you are using them and do not drop them so to avoid loud noise especially at Consecration time.

SWITCH OFF YOUR PHONE: When you enter the Church, it may be possible that you hear "the call of God". However, it is unlikely that He will call you on your mobile. It may be a good exercise to switch it off or at least put it on silent before you enter the Church. If you want to talk to God, find a quiet place, pray and talk to Him.

CRANFORD PARISH: Our neighbouring Parish of Our Lady & St Christopher, Cranford will be closed for a few weeks as urgent repairs need to be carried out on their Church. During this time, you may see an increase of activities here at Heston as we are offering them a help by using our Church where their sacraments and funerals may be celebrated.

BLESSED PALMS: If you have Blessed Palms from past Palm Sundays please bring them to the Parish Office so we can collect them for our Burning of Palms in preparation for Ash Wednesday. Please make sure that Blessed Palms are brought to us by Sunday 11 February.

CAKE SALE: Next Sunday the Vocationist Cooperators will hold a Cake Sale after 9.30am Mass to raise funds for Vocations. Donations of home baked or store bake cakes are welcome!

AVAILBAILITY FORM: Readers and Eucharistic Ministers should have received the Availability form via email, if you have not paper copies are available at the back of the Church. Make sure you hand in your form or email it to the Office by no later than Friday 17 February. If you have given your email and have not received it, please write to the office at heston@rcdow.org.uk. Emailing the forms helps us to be more efficient and use less paper.

FIRST CONFESSIONS: Please pray for the children enrolled in the FHC Programme for this year as next Saturday they will celebrate their first confession. Please pray for them as they prepare for this special day. There will be rehearsals on Thursday 8 February at 3.45 pm. First Confessions will be celebrated on Saturday 10 February at 11 am.

BURNING OF PALMS: The burning of palms will take place on Tuesday 13 February after the 9.30 am Mass. Afterwards, we will share pancakes with the FHC Children outside the Church if the weather allows it.

ASH WEDNESDAY: Wednesday 14 February, this year, marks Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten season. Ash Wednesday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

DONATION ENVELOPES: We are at that time of the year when we need to put an order for Gift-Aid and Planned Giving envelopes and we want to make sure that we order the right number of boxes and do not have the Parish pay for boxes, which then will sit in the Office waiting to be collected. If you give your donations by Standing Order then we will not be ordering you a donation box, if you still wish to have a box of envelopes please let the Parish Secretary know so we can make sure we have our details up to date.

MASS INTENTIONS: We are now booking mass intentions for 2024 up until June.

MASS ATTENDANCE CARD: We have noticed that a number of families do not have an attendance card for their children. The attendance card is for children who are 2yo up to those in Year 5 and you will need for when you are going to apply for a Catholic School as it will help priests make sure you

have attended Mass regularly and therefore they can sign the form. If you do not have one please contact the office.

SACRAMENTS

BAPTISMS: Please use the form on the Parish Website to enquire about the Baptism for your child. We celebrate Baptisms on a Saturday only; we ask that you give us minimum 6 weeks' notice.

MARRIAGE: If you are planning to marry, we can only start the paperwork needed by the diocese 6 months prior your wedding day. Whether you are marrying in the UK or abroad we need minimum 6 months' notice, especially if we need to arrange a marriage course. Please do not leave it to the last minute!
