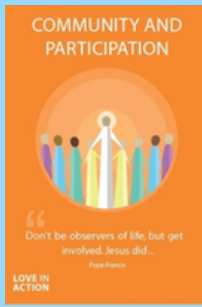


“Learning with CHRIST as our guide”.

It was a fantastic session that helped build their confidence and awareness when out and about.

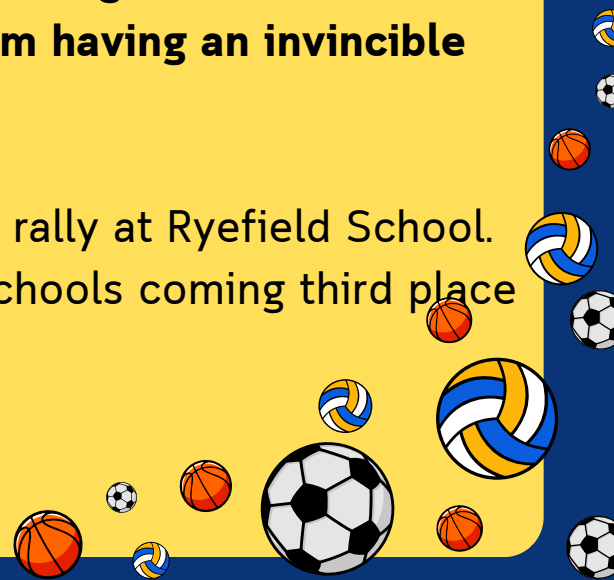


SPORTS

Last week we heard about a boy called Edward from the charity Mary's meals. Edward's greatest wish was to go to school and to have food to eat.

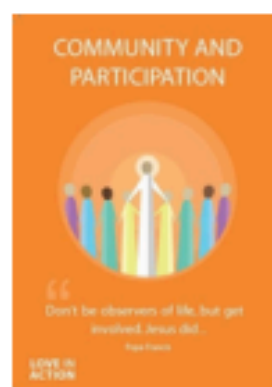
During Lent we have been thinking about our responsibility to take action and support our global community .
