New Sound System The second stage of the choir new sound system, the platform extension, has now been completed apart from the varnishing which will be take place during this coming week. Thanks are due to the team who completed this new structure upon which the console cabinet will be sited, together with one of the two benches which have temporarily been removed. It is very important that no one walks on it for at least 4 days after the final coat is applied, so please keep off the surface for next two weeks. Delivery of the new cabinet is expected around the middle of January. Installation of all the equipment to be housed within the cabinet and above the altar is scheduled for the week starting on February 17th, and the full system should be operational for the start of Lent in early March. Further updates will follow.
