Music and our songs of praise have always been an important part of our Sunday liturgy and it would be wonderful to see it develop even more with a greater number of people involved. We are verv

grateful for the musicians that we have playing the organ or guitar/violin/flute etc but we really do need some more support. We have an urgent need for people who can play the organ or keyboard (as we do have an electronic keyboard which can feed into the sound system.) The organ is played at the 8.30 Mass every Sunday and the 10.30 Mass on the 1st and 2nd Sundays of the month. They are sometimes away and therefore we need more people to help support them and occasionally lead the music. All instruments welcome.
