This weekend - Attached is a letter from the Cardinal, encouraging our participation in the "Growing in Faith" programme that all the parishes in the Diocese are sharing, to sustain and develop prayerful living Parishes; through developing a Parish Project, details of which are in a letter from Fr Michael (also attached). Also supporting Caritas Westminster which addresses the needs of people who are experiencing difficulties in their financial and personal lives, for whatever reason and other people who are in need of care and attention, as they are isolated and far from their famlies. At the moment, there are 15 Schools which are supported through "Magic Breakfasts and a whole range of concern for people who are being trafficked, practical support is being offered to Foodbanks. We seek to support and enrich married life across the Parish, with the involvement of "Chemin Neuf",

a Group one of whose objectives is the enrichment of the lives of Parishioners, living their Marriage Covenant. We are also looking to upgrade our Hall and improve its eco-friendly and economic returns for our investment, heating, lighting and insulation. We have had two weeks as a trial run of the process and the response so far has been very encouraging. We are grateful to those who came to see us or who have been visited at home. Please remember to return the Envelope, in the ways that were suggested, as soon as you can - they can easily get forgotten! Parishioners are involved in prayer, being volunteers and, only if that is possible, financially: so far we have received 12 pledges covering the five coming years to the amount of £25,530.
